NYS Boater Safety Course

The KLC has once again arranged for a NYS Boater Safety Course this spring, sponsored by the Columbia County Sheriff's Office and the NY State Park Police. It is designed as a comprehensive boating course, teaching the fundamentals of safe boating operation. It is an 8-hour class and anyone over the age of 10 can attend at no cost.





Remember to Have Your Septic Tank Cleaned This Summer



Proper maintenance of your septic system is the best means to help control waste water from reaching the lake. It is recommended that property owners on or near the shoreline have their septic tank cleaned once every two years. If your tank was not cleaned last year, please contact a licensed septic cleaning service to do so this year and do your part to help keep our lake clean.

















KLC Board Elections

Copper Sulfate Treatments

The KLC has applied for this year's DEC Permit to treat the Lake with copper sulfate to combat the growth of bluegreen algae. With the approved permit, copper sulfate will be applied around the lake once every 2 weeks during June, July, and August, usually on a Monday morning. Notification will be posted around the lake and on our website, kinderhooklakecorp.org, at least 24 hours in advance of each application. Please be advised of the necessary restrictions as found on the FAQ page of our website.

In case you haven't been down to the Rt. 28 launch this spring, the KLC has installed a new wooden dock at the ramp. The dock was constructed in pieces by Bill Cleary. Installation was aided by Bernie Kelleher, Rick Theriault, Mike Franceour, Drew Nelson and sons, and Dan Langer. The old dock was stabilized and relocated closer to the bridge for use by car-top boaters. Thanks for everyone's help.



Weed Committee Progress

The KLC Weed Committee has been hard at work this winter evaluating options to address the Lake's expanding aquatic invasive species (AIS) problem. The Committee has made recommendations and received Board approval to move forward with several initiatives.

Instead of using herbicides, the Committee has applied to DEC for a permit to use benthic barriers this summer. Two barriers will be purchased and moved around the lake to various weed beds for 2-3 week



periods in June and July to assess their impact on the weed beds. Results will be shared with members in the fall.

AIS will be mapped in the Lake this summer. Volunteers will be taking a one-day training course in June. Using cell phones or tablets, these volunteer 'Citizen Scientists' will be able to identify and locate AIS around the lake and upload data to the NY iMapInvasives and DEC database to serve as baseline data for future AIS initiatives. A huge thanks to the 'Citizen

Scientists' willing to take the time to help with this important project.

A few more volunteers are still needed to help map AIS through iMapInvasives. If you are interested and available to take the June 4th training course in Albany, please send a message to klcnews@archman8.com and you will receive further information.

Did You Know?

Largemouth bass prefer temperatures of 82 to 84 degrees, smallmouth a couple degrees cooler. Everything else being equal, this is the temperature they occupy if available. However, bass function quite well from 39 to 90 degrees.

Help Us Eradicate Invasive Species

In addition to the benthic barriers and iMapInvasives initiatives mentioned in the article to the left, the Weed Committee has also arranged for a weed-pulling event that needs your help.



The Committee has designated **Saturday**, **June 11th**, 9am to 11am, for hand-pulling of water chestnuts at the north end of the lake. 20+ volunteers with canoes, kayaks or row boats are needed to access the shallow water. Please bring rakes and gloves and meet at the north end of the lake at 9am. Last year 12 volunteers pulled a large amount

of water chestnuts. This year we hope that 20+ volunteers will pull an amazing amount of weeds.

Light refreshments provided by the KLC will be available. Also, please remember that pulling weeds can be messy, so dress accordingly and be prepared to shower and to wash out your watercraft afterwards.

Together we will make a difference.

- Fishing tournaments are <u>not</u> permitted on Kinderhook Lake without written permission in advance from the KLC. In addition, all tournament attendees must be current KLC members. Please contact Bill Cleary at 518-784-3914 30 days in advance if you wish to sponsor a fishing tournament.
- Launch gate keys are for <u>KLC members only</u>. Please do not share your keys with non-members or you risk losing your gate privileges. Remember to lock the gate after entering or leaving the lake to prevent unauthorized access.
- 3. Please abide by all "Recreation Guidelines" that are posted at the Rt. 28 launch site and can be found on our website at kinderhooklakecorp.org.

Practice Catch and Release



Fish contribute to nutrient recycling and help maintain the natural ecosystem processes when they live out their entire lifecycle, from spawning to death, in the aquatic system. Catch and release fishing improves our fish population by allowing more fish to remain and reproduce. This practice provides an opportunity for increasing numbers of anglers to enjoy fishing and to successfully catch fish. Releasing all fish caught in Kinderhook Lake will ensure that the enjoyment of this recreational sport will last for generations to come.




